# A COMMUNIST--NAZI ALLIANCE IN RUSSIA?

The alliance between the Communists and the Nazis, which was formulated by the Hitler-Stalin pact, inflicted a monstrous tragedy upon mankind. It led directly to the Second World War.

The possibility that a similar alliance between Communists and Nationalists may attain power in Russia is alarming. Such an alliance would have the enormous arsenal of nuclear weapons at its disposal.

This alliance already exists in embryonic form. It is playing a leading role in the opposition to Boris Yeltsin.

The U.S. Communist newspaper, PEOPLE'S DAILY WORLD, has a correspondent in Moscow, named Mike Davidow, and each issue of PEOPLE'S DAILY WORLD carries his report captioned "Moscow Diary".

His report in the April 3 edition is sub-captioned, "Russia's Fight for Constitutional Rule", and it states:

"The lines are now more sharply drawn throughout the Russian Federation. There have been more than 100 mass demonstrations all over Russia. Moscow has been the scene of almost non-stop demonstrations and marches since the huge Feb. 23 march and rally overwhelmingly dominated by the forces of the patriotic-left alliance"

### What's in a Name?

What is the patriotic-left alliance? The fact that it is an alliance signifies the partnership of two separate entities. The "patriots" are the chauvinistic Russian Nationalists, who are comparable to the chauvinistic German nationalists, whom Hitler recruited for Nazism, and the "left" consists of the Communists and alleged ex-Communists who still cling to the tenets of Marxism-Leninism.

By the time this is being read, the fate of Yeltsin, and possibly of democracy and free enterprise in Russia, may have been determined by the referendum. As this is being written, the situation is described by Davidow as follows:

"The essence of what is taking place in the Russian Federation is this: what started out as the 'death of Communism' is being transformed into the discrediting of capitalism. This dialectical process explains the drastic decline in the influence of the pro-capitalist 'democrats,' the desperate struggle being waged by Boris

Yeltsin, the rise of the <u>patriotic-left alliance</u> and the fears of Yeltsin's overseas supporters that their 'chance of the century' may vet escape them. This dialectical process can be traced in the dramatic change in the relationship of forces in the Congress of Deputies and Supreme Soviet since December 1991."

Beware of the patriotic-left alliance!

# A Family Tragedy

The staff of the Crusade is like a close-knit family. Most staff members have worked for the Crusade for many years. Our three executives--Fred Schwarz, President; James Colbert, Chairman; and Ella Doorn, Secretary--have together spent over 120 years in the service of the Crusade. All three were present at the birth of the Crusade 40 years ago.

Like all families, we have our crises and our tragedies. Here is one:



The Superintendent of our mailing room is an African American who has worked with us for 12 years. Jerome Harris is a devoted father of four children. His 17-year-old daughter, Mary, is an outstanding athlete who was offered an athletic scholarship at a national university.

Like a thunder clap, on Friday evening, February 26, we heard the news that Mary had been shot. After attending a basket ball match, she had gone to the home of a girl friend. In the group that had gathered, there was a 16-year-old boy, who was in possession of a loaded gun. His sister attempted to take the gun from him, and it discharged accidentally. The bullet struck Mary in the face below her right eye, and took a circuitous path around the head and neck, until it lodged in the body of the lowest cervical vertebre, where it remains.

Miraculously, it struck no vital organs during its circuit.

Mary was hospitalized, and Jerome and the family were devastated. On one occasion, Jerome could not talk to me because he was weeping so profusely.

We all joined in prayer for Mary, and happily she is making good progress. The prospects are bright for her well-nigh complete recovery. Reconstructive surgery on her face still lies ahead. Please pray for her.

#### MAN'S INHUMANITY TO MAN

What do you know--or care--about Tajikistan? It is a small Republic, with five million inhabitants, in what was formerly the Soviet Union. It is sandwiched between Uzbekistan, Afghanistan, Pakistan and China.

# ANTI-COMMUNISM SEMINARS IN PANAMA, COSTA RICA, AND GUATEMALA By Rev. James Colbert

During our recent trip to Central America, we met no one who told us that "Communism is dead". On the contrary, wherever we went we were told of the dangerous activities of the Communists, and the need for help in combatting them.

During March, our Spanish Director, Sergio Navarrete, and I conducted anti-Communism seminars in Panama, Costa Rica, and Guatemala. We were joined and assisted by our faithful colleague, Vinicio Vargas of Costa Rica, who had arranged our itinerary.

Vinicio is well respected among the pastors, churches and social organizations of Costa Rica. He has been associated with many organizations including World Vision, Voice of the Martyrs, the Assembly of God, Labor Unions, and large American Companies. I was encouraged and humbled when he assured me that the Christian Anti-Communism Crusade had done more for Costa Rica than any other Christian organization.

My encouragement was tinged with sadness because I had to tell him that we may need to reduce some of our work and projects in Costa Rica and other countries in Central and South America. The widespread delusion that "Communism is dead" has caused the financial support for the Crusade to diminish.

#### Panama

After we had conducted the morning session of our seminar in Panama City, a Professor from the University of Panama asked if we could come back later this year to address the university students, who number approximately 34,000.

For many years the Soviet Communists gave free and attractive scholarships to brilliant young students from Latin America. Many of these students have returned and now hold leading positions in their respective countries. There are so many professors, teaching at the University of Panama, who are graduates from the Patrice Lumumba University in Moscow, that they hold a large alumni reunion each year.

After I had outlined the Marxist analysis of the capitalist system, a student arose and said: "This is what we are told at this University. How can I minister to my friends who are deceived by Communism? Communism is certainly not dead at the university of Panama."

#### Chitre

From Panama City, we drove for 4-1/2 hours to Chitre and conducted a seminar in that city's branch of the University of Panama. Every seat in the conference room was filled. Among the audience there were many professors. They showed great interest as I discussed Perestroika and current events in the Soviet Union.

This seminar was sponsored by a group of churches which had rented the conference room. Most of those in attendance wrote their names and addresses and asked for literature and our monthly newsletter. One pastor said: "These seminars are very important for our country because Communism is definitely not dead in Latin America. It is the victims of Communism who are dead."

While we were in Panama, we learned that three United States missionaries, serving with the New Tribes Mission, had been kidnapped by a Communist guerrilla group.

# David Chiriqui

Driving north, we reached the city known as "David Chiriqui", where we spoke for 45 minutes over radio. The estimated audience was 50,000. We then proceeded to conduct our seminar. Most of those attending were university students. One student group, called "Kai Alpha", presented us with a written petition asking for our literature. They also invited us to return and give lectures at the university.

We visited a Bible College, which is presenting an anti-Communism course, using "You Can Trust the Communists (to be Communists)" by Dr. Schwarz as the textbook, along with the Crusade study kit.

The professor, Alcides Barrera, had been a Communist while a student at the University of Panama. He has been converted and has become a Christian. Four years ago he learned about the Christian Anti-Communism Crusade and since then he has been using the writings of Dr. Schwarz to teach his students. He told us that his objective is to enable his students to recognize Communism and to defeat it.

# Banana Workers

Both students and workers are of primary importance to the Communists. Their strategy is to recruit idealistic students and use them to recruit workers.

After teaching the students, we conducted seminars for the workers in the banana plantations. We drove for about 2-1/2 hours from David Chiriqui and arrived at one of the four towns built by the Chiquita Banana Company. These towns are located in a green banana jungle, and each town is largely self-contained having its own local government and school system. The bicycle is the major means of transport used in these towns.

One goal of the Communists is to destabilize the economy, and thereby raise the revolutionary consciousness of the workers until they revolt. I endeavored to show the workers how they can be exploited by Communists who promise to improve their conditions when their real objective is to lower them, and I am confident that my message was understood. From time to time I used the phrase, "do you understand?" to test this, and a thunderous response of "si" (yes) was given each time.

# Costa Rica

It took us 8 hours of tedious driving to reach San Jose, the capital of Costa Rica. In that city we were presented with a remarkable opportunity by the director of the Trinity Broadcasting Network. In the Costa Rican studios of that network, all the programs for the "TBN" television of Latin America, with a potential viewing audience of 500 million, are produced. The director asked for videos of our message so that they could be presented throughout Latin America over the TBN television stations.

From San Jose we traveled for two hours along a twisting, winding road through mountains to Puntarenas. Vinicio drove. He almost flew around the curves, while Sergio prayed for mercy, and I sat stiffly in my seat. I told Vinicio that I could now tell the people of the United States that I have truly risked my life to defend freedom in Costa Rica, and I made him promise to go and have his eyes checked. He only laughed.

At the Puntarenas seminar a lady said, "My son studied medicine in Moscow for two years. He is now studying in Berlin, Germany. He tells me that Russia used to be much better under Communism than it is now." I endeavored to explain the changes that have taken place in Russia and Eastern Europe, and both the opportunities and dangers that now exist.

# The Missing Issue

HE CLINTON era is underway, but already the new team has been knocked off stride by the withering reaction to the President's decision to legalize homosexuals in the military.

While the spotlight has centered on this question, a far larger, underlying issue is being ignored. For where is any debate, let alone recognition, that the bedrock, pro-faith and family values upon which America's future rests are under frightful assault, and that, day-by-day, this nation is distancing itself from its Judaeo-Christian roots? Put another way, even if Mr. Clinton's economic policies are sound and right—admittedly, a dubious proposition to many of us—how well he stokes the engines of our economy will matter little if the hull beneath continues to rot and the ship itself has lost its way.

To me, this is the missing issue—it is the real issue; I would even say it is the pre-eminent issue of the Nineties

- —when crime among children has reached epidemic levels and living anywhere in America today is like living in Dodge City;
- —when a person committing a serious offense can expect to spend, on average, only eight days in prison;
- —when one in four black males is in jail, on probation, or free on bail, and two-thirds of black babies, and one-quarter of white babies are born illegitimate;
- —when fifty years ago the top problems cited in our public schools were talking out of turn, chewing gum, running in halls, cutting in line, dress code infraction, and littering; today they are drug and alcohol abuse, pregnancy, suicide, rape, and robbery;
- —and when the New York City public-school system tried, albeit failed, to ram down the throats of its first-graders the overtly homosexual, Children of the Rainbow Curriculum (Heather Has Two Mommies

and *Daddy's Roommate*) along with materials to other students describing the joys of masturbation and other explicit sexual topics.

As one rebellious yet highly prescient schoolboard member, Irene Impellizzeri, warned: "Self-discipline is not an instinct; it is learned from adults. . . . But if children of the poor are taught they need not be constrained by the social order and its civilities . . . that they have the right—unearned—to set their own standards, or no standards at all . . . without serving any apprenticeship to reality, without, in fact, learning to think—as distinct from feel or want—they will never, ever escape poverty."

Just as rapidly and rabidly as we embrace sex in its lewdest forms, we are turning away from the sanctity of life. And we are turning away from God. To judge by media focus, we apparently live in a society where the Madonna most worshipped is the one who appears naked in a metal-covered book, not the one written about in the Bible. Who would have foreseen American schools where the dispensing of family values is replaced by the dispensing of condoms, where sexual deviation is embraced and God is expelled.

When three of Ronald Reagan and George Bush's Supreme Court nominees recently joined their liberal colleagues to declare unconstitutional a rabbi's nonsectarian prayer at a public-school commencement, they turned the whole sense and spirit of the First Amendment on its head. Intended by the Founding Fathers to be a constitutional bulwark of freedom of religion, the First Amendment is now routinely invoked to bully and bludgeon religious freedom in any public setting.

I received a secret prayer from an anonymous student who describes the predicament. He writes:

Now I sit me down in school, Where praying is against the rule; For this great nation under God,

Finds public mention of Him quite odd. Any prayer a class recites, Now violates the Bill of Rights; The law is specific, the law is precise: Praying aloud is no longer nice; Praying out loud in a public hall Upsets believers in nothing-at-all. In silence alone we can meditate. And if God should be reached, well, that's great.

This rule, however, has one gimmick in it,

You have to be finished in less than a minute. So all I ask is a minute of quiet,

And if I feel like praying, then maybe I'll try it: If not, O Lord, this one plea I make:

Should I be knifed in school, my soul You'll take.

We had better recognize this poem for what it is a cry for help from America's future.

O, THIS IS AMERICA, 1993. How did we reach such a state—in this land, where, for generations, mothers and fathers bravely risked their lives and came streaming to these shores to give their children the freedom to worship God without fear or favor? How can there be such cowardice and silence in the face of this outrageous trashing of America's most treasured traditions? Where are the voices of the Catholic Church, the Protestant mainline churches, and leaders of the Jewish community? Where are the leaders of the Republican and Democratic Parties?

It is one thing to promise to preserve and defend the Constitution. But who will preserve and defend the values which are the foundation of our greatness? If it is no longer politically correct to revere and defend our most basic rights, perhaps we might recall the words of an American giant whose quiet, lonely, heroic courage personified the true meaning of leadership.

Beset by the crises of his day, Abraham Lincoln said: "We have forgotten the gracious hand that preserved us in peace, and multiplied and enriched and strengthened us; and we have vainly imagined in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own . . . we have become too proud to pray to the God that made us!"

I have served my country in government and enthusiastically participated in the business world for over forty years. But the cumulative experience of all those years has only reinforced the simple and timeless truth of Lincoln's eloquent words.

Vital as they are, sound policies—less government, low tax rates, and a strong defense—are not enough. America will never be healed and never be truly strong, until we acknowledge, once again, the pre-eminent importance of our values, until we are willing to humble ourselves, and until we are not too proud to pray. -WILLIAM E. The March 22-April 4 edition of the magazine laments:

"Women, who until recently comprised 51 percent of the workforce--and 60 percent for all Soviet workers with higher education--are today being urged, brain-washed and soon, very probably, legislated back to their premodern status as homemakers and mothers."

How low can they fall, or be pushed? The report states:

"Russian Labor Minister Gennady Melikyan achieved the rare feat of shocking a room full of hard-boiled Western journalists into stunned silence. 'Why should we employ women when men are unemployed?' he demanded. 'It's better that men work and women take care of children and do the housework. I don't want women to be offended, but I seriously don't think women should work while men are doing nothing'."

"The Russian media, which is capable of being progressive on some other issues, has enthusiastically embraced the campaign to drive women back into the traditional, subservient and dependent roles." (Pages 22 and 23)
