This also explains why there is such intense hostility toward Christianity. We hold that there is absolute truth, that Christ Himself is the Truth. But

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the postmodern mind says there is no such thing, and it resists anyone who argues there is.

It doesn't do us any good to fight the war over homosexual rights or abortion or family values unless we understand what is at the heart of the struggle. It is a deep, philosophical issue: the issue of truth.

Living as we do in postmodern times demands a new, fresh, Christian apologetic. Christians must be prepared to defend the concept of truth to answer life's major questions. We must learn to present the Gospel to a new generation.

We must be prepared to defend the importance of Christian truth in American culture. Our society is breaking down into small groups, each with its own concept of truth. The "political correctness" movement is no joke. It's a sad commentary on postmodern times. If this insidious factionalism continues, I believe we will lose the common moral understandings that bind our society together.

So the stakes are very high in the culture war. And to engage in it wisely--whether it's with our colleagues at the office, our neighbors next door, or as a citizen volunteer in local government--we must understand today's prevailing ethos. And that's why *Postmodern Times* by Ed Veith is such an important book--and why I'd like you to have a copy.
