Denmark may outlaw unsafe sex by AIDS carriers

COPENHAGEN, Denmark — The government is considering making it a crime for people infected with the AIDS virus to have sex without using condoms, the health and justice ministers said yesterday.

The announcement followed a Supreme Court ruling overturning the reckless endangerment conviction of Diego Guerino Joanis, 35, a Haitian-born street musician infected with the human immunodeficiency virus. He was sentenced to 18 months in jail for having sex with 23 women and two 13-year-old girls without using a condom.

An eight-month sentence for having sex with the girls was upheld. Joanis has served that sentence.

"It's unacceptable that someone can consciously put others at risk without the community having a reaction against it," Health Minister Torben Lund said.

Justice Minister Erling Olsen said the government would consider changing the law since "the criminal code does not provide the basis" for punishing an AIDS-infected person who fails to protect his or her sex partner.

Members of Parliament's Legal Committee are to meet on the issue next week. But a member of the op-

position Socialist People's Party, Pernille Frahm, supported the Supreme Court decision, saying: "Two parties are involved in the practice of unsafe sex and the responsibility must be mutual."

Joanis was convicted in March 1993 of recklessly endangering the lives of his sexual partners. But the

Supreme Court ruled Thursday that the health law was unclear about what was expected of Joanis.

The Western Danish High Court immediately reversed the conviction of a woman infected with the AIDS virus who had been sentenced to three months for endangering a man's life by having sex with him.
