G-G's 'mind so open his brain has fallen out'

THE Australian Federation for the Family has condemned Governor-General Bill Hayden's endorsement of euthanasia, homosexual marriage and homosexual adoption rights as 'irresponsible' and 'incomprehensible'.

Federation director Jack Sonnemann this week said it was unthinkable that children could be raised by those who were 'sexually disturbed enough to desire their own gender'.

"It is beyond comprehension how anyone could consider saying such comments publicly," said Mr Sonnemann.

In a speech made at a Gold Coast medical conference last week Mr Hayden said he did not see any difference between passive and active euthanasia and he supported the new Northern Territory legislation legalising voluntary euthanasia.

He also said he supported the rights of homosexual couples to marry and adopt children.

"I think it shows how out of touch the Labor Party is with the community," said Mr Sonne-

mann, who will be speaking at a public meeting at the Burleigh Heads Christian Community Church on Sunday night.

"Walk up to ordinary people in Australia and ask them if they think homosexuals should adopt children and killing our old people — we should be doing what we can to enhance character of life.

"I think there are times when you can have such an open mind that your brain falls out."

The Sunshine Coast anti-porn crusader said his main agenda was to rid the nation of pornography and its damaging effect on our culture.


Mr Sonnemann said it was the easy over-the-counter sale of pornographic magazines, such as Penthouse and Playboy, which contributed to Australia having the highest level of sex attacks in the industrialised world.

He said despite fierce lobbying, the Queensland Government continued to allow the sale of pornographic magazines to young children.

"Just like the tobacco experts come out and say there is no link between tobacco and cancer, the pornography industry says there is no direct link between pornography and rape," said Mr Sonnemann.

"We already allow more women to be raped than anywhere else in the world.

"We need men and women of character and integrity in power who know the difference between right and wrong. Selling pornography is wrong."
