# **Two Americans Killed By Red Army**

On September 12, the ex-Soviet republic, Belarus, shot down two American participants in the world's most prestigious long distance balloon race.

Organizers of the Gordon Bennett Balloon Race had obtained permits allowing flight over Belarus air space

and yet, a Belarussian helicopter gunship fired a missile that exploded the balloon and killed the two innocent Americans.

Finally, after 24 hours of silence, the Belarussian government, charging that the Americans had ignored radio and gunfire warnings, argued that the dead Americans and two other forceddown American balloon teams had illegally approached a Belarussian airbase and missile launching site. #### Is Belarus Benign or Belligerant

In a just released European Security Study, Russta's Outer Rim, Mark Almond explains the military importance of Belarus.

"The strategic position of Belarus astride the direct route between Moscow and the West has always made it important to Russian military planners. As a result, Belarus today possesses more tanks than any West European state. Many of them are Russian-owned, and certainly all are built to the same specifications ..."

Almond paints a disturbing picture of past and present governments of Belarus, describing the 1991 Belarus leadership as an "openly pro-Soviet regime", and noting that little has changed since then. The victor of Belarus' 1994 presidential elections was Alexander Lukashenko who made no secret of his admiration of KGB heroes like Dzerzhinsky and Andropov", and in the May 1995 parliamentary elections large majorities of the Belarussians voted for

but insisted that the order to shoot down the balloonists was appropriate.

### The West Waffles

The West seems to be treating this deliberate act of international terrorism as an unfortunate misunderstanding, when it may well have been a test of the West's resolve in the matter of Russia's attempts to reestablish control and influcloser links with Russia as well as a restoration of Soviet-style symbols.

#### Gradual Russian Reintegration?

The pro-Russian attitude of the Belarussian people and the pro-Soviet KGB attitude of the Belarussian government demonstrate a readiness of the Belarussians to be absorbed into greater Russia in spite of having suffered decades under brutal Soviet tyranny. This conveniently plays into the hands of the current batch of Russia's empirebuilding leaders who are still closet communists.

In a January 1994 address to Russia's ambassadors, foreign minister Andrei Kozyrev asked rhetorically, "What is wrong with Russia announcing as its goal the gradual reintegration — primarily economic — of the post-Soviet space on a voluntary and



# of A Treaty

Unfortunately, the Clinton administration, with its patchwork quilt foreign policy, seems unwilling to confront the renewed threat of Russian aggrandizement. personnel carriers, artillery and combat aircraft in Eastern Europe.

In the September 16, New York Times, Steven Greenhouse reported "In a concession intended to reduce tensions with Moscow, the United States and its NATO allies decided today to permit Russia to keep more tanks and artillery pieces in the Cau-casus regions than would be allowed under a 1990 treaty." U.S. and NATO officials explained that they are allowing Russia to ignore the treaty's weapons limits so as "to preserve the treaty".

Russia states her intent to break the treaty. The

West then excuses Russia from the treaty obligations. Although a treaty broken by one party is no longer a treaty, the West will, of course, still abide by the treaty requirements in the name of "preserving the treaty"!

By agreeing to this "treaty" farce, and by accepting the Belarussian Balloon murders as just an international misunderstanding, the Clinton administration and its CFR-dominated State Department have once again clearly demonstrated to the world their total incompetence in foreign affairs.
